Dear Professor Harrer,

I have only now received your letter which you sent to Delhi long ago and I hasten to write to you on the assumption that this letter will still reach you before you leave Austria again. As you can see, whether fortunately or unfortunately, I am now no longer in this fascinating India. I have been transferred to the UNESCO office here in Nairobi.

I particularly regret that I did not stay a little bit longer in Delhi as you mentioned in your letter that you would have come this time with King Leopold of Belgium. I wonder what kind of venture you are now contemplating with King Leopold in the Asian continent. I know that you were eager to explore parts of Mongolia and I should like to know whether you have already taken steps to initiate such an expedition. I am certain that you will meet the Dalai Lama in Dharmasala and also our common friends in Delhi.

I really do hope that one of your other trips will bring you to this part of the world and I can really assure you that I would be at your disposal whenever you come to Nairobi and I can tell you already that you would be most welcome to stay with me at my house, whether you come alone or with any companions.

From Mr. Westerhoff in Paris I heard that you would be considered for any future assignments for UNESCO in your field which may arise in the future. After all, you could come with the support of Mr. Maurice Herzog, which relationship I would advise you to cultivate.

I am sure it will not be news to you when I tell you that we received this enormous shock over the destruction of our hotel ~~am~~ "Hahnenkamm". We are now in the middle of the process of restoring the hotel this summer, not, however, with so many beds any more, but in a more practical and up-to-date fashion.

Now let me convey to you my very best and warmest regards and greetings and also to your wife and I do hope to hear from you soon again.
